

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

JESUS WORKHEET PACK FOR PRESCHOOLERS AND KINDERGARTENERS (US letter size)

Tracing, drawing, coloring, cutting, gluing, sorting, counting, sequencing,... and much more!

The pack consists of 45 worksheets with simple and clear instructions. They are all based on the life and work of Jesus Christ (for instance the motivation for practicing straight vertical lines: "Trace the lines and then draw your own lines to create the shine that the shepherds saw when an angel appeared to them and told them about the birth of Jesus.").

All mathematical worksheets that work with number concepts also come in a version without numerals — if the child does not yet know how to write numerals, his/her assignment is to draw the corresponding number of lines or dots.

The sequence of pre-writing skills goes from the easier to the more difficult elements.

Some of the worksheets are available in two versions:

- 1. easier version is marked with I. the assignment is easier, mathematical sheets do not use numerals (instead, corresponding number of dots or lines is used: five dots instead of the number 5, etc.
- 2. more difficult version is marked with II. the assignment is a little bit more difficult, mathematical sheets work with numerals

All worksheets are black and white. Almost all of the worksheets are double-sided.

Majority of pictures were drawn by Nikol Hauck. Other pictures belong to Richard Gunther (FreeBibleimages.org or lambsongs.co.nz) and Didier Martin (mylittlehouse.org). Those pictures were used and altered with the permission of the authors.

PRINTING:

If the page does not print properly (the picture or words are cut off), change the settings on your printer. You need to set it so that it prints a full page, border-free, from edge to edge. This setting is usually under Printing Preferences → layout → Margins.

This worksheet pack has been made to fit in the letter size (8.5×11) inches). The size A4 is also available.


Each one-sided worksheet (e.g. JESUS IS BORN) is followed by a blank page. This is done for the purpose of easier printing - if you choose to print the whole material at once, thanks to these blank pages you end up with the double-sided worksheets on one paper.
